

WASHOE COUNTY LIBRARY SYSTEM



In July, the [Reno Gazette-Journal](#) followed up on a reader question about weeding in the Washoe County Library System by interviewing Resources Librarian Debi Stears, who is working to update the collection. Stears confirmed that in most cases, materials that have not been checked out for more than four years are pulled from the collection to make way for new materials.

Weeding [can be controversial](#), as current WCLS Director Jeff Scott found in his previous position at Berkeley Public Library. Stears did a good job explaining the necessity for weeding, as well as the need for a “human touch” in making weeding decisions.


ND NORTH DAKOTA






Custer County Library had an unfortunate visitor in late August when a car crashed into the side of the building. No one was injured, but the library was closed as a precaution while the damage was repaired.

In the early 1930s, a group of women gathered to serve the Roscoe region by building a library. The library closed in 2002 after the group that built it, the Priscilla Club, was no longer able to maintain and operate it. Cleaned and repainted, the library opened again in June to serve kids in the community. Phyllis Guthmiller and Pam Garner, with nearly 90 combined years of teaching experience, have reopened the library, housed in the original 12 by 14 foot building.


