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MPLA President January 2008 Board Report Wayne Hanway

Highlights of the time since the October 10th Executive Board meeting include the following.

Portal – The implementation task force has been hard at work, and I hope that their specific proposals for Board action will allow us to get the portal up and running. This is not a simple thing, but involves several complex steps. Do this in a cost-effective way that will free us from institutional host restrictions is going to be a plus, because it will make it easier for us to more-easily implement further changes as we need them.

Professional Development Committee appointments – Unlike our other committees, which function from one annual conference to the next, the Professional Development Committee functions on a calendar year basis. Sandra Barstow's term as committee chair expired at the end of December, as did the terms of three committee members. My thanks to Connie Lamb for agreeing to serve as committee chair for 2008, as well as to Andrew Chanse, Mardi Mahaffy, and Tamara Meredith for their willingness to serve.

Conference planning – While Rob Banks has been ably carrying the big load of working directly with the ULA conference planning team, I have still been involved in a number of decisions and points of detail. NLA/NEMA conference – My final state conference visit of the year was to the Nebraska Library Association/Nebraska Educational Media Association joint conference at Kearney, October 24th – 26th.
