MPLA-L continues to be liberally supplied with updates on current IF issues - especially those related to Children's Internet Protection Act and the Patriot Act. Traffic on the CIPA, NCIPA, and Patriot Act issues has been particularly heavy during the past two months.

Committee members have reported Intellectual Freedom challenges in Nevada (exhibit in library), Wyoming (book), and North Dakota (book). No action was requested from the MPLA Intellectual Freedom Committee.

Immroth Award Goes to Tattered Cover Bookstore Owner

One of MPLA's longtime friends, the Tattered Cover Bookstore, was recognized for their defense of Intellectual Freedom at the Annual American Library Association Conference. The bookstore employees and management resisted pressure to disclose information about their patrons.
