The Vice-chair, Melissa Heckard has begun preparations for the Professional Forum to be held in conjunction with 2004 MPLA/CAL Conference in Denver. It is hoped that early and sustained advertising along in conjunction with other efforts will result in an excellent session.

The Section members would like to sponsor another session about Academic Librarians and Non-Traditional Research similar to the "Outside the Boundaries" session at the 2003 conference. David Alexander has agreed to work on coordinating this session. Other ideas suggested included reorganizing organizational structure, redesigning space, collaborative workspaces, mentoring, project management, assessment (outcomes based), academic writing (how to put a paper together-possible preconference), open source applications, Prospero vs Ariel vs Illiad, creating tutorials, 2 way video conferencing, distance education/online services, faculty status - pros and cons.

A message requesting program ideas was sent out using Member Clicks. A speaker suggested by Suzanne Taylor in response to the message was Catherine Murray-Rust, Colorado State University on the topic of the future of higher education. Vice-Chair Melissa Heckard also suggested several ideas. In addition she identified possible speakers for topics suggested at the section meeting.
