Responses from Non-Renewing MPLA Leadership Institute Participants, Board Choice Members, and Recipients of Free State Conference Memberships March 26, 2009

Introduction

The Executive Secretary sent e-mail messages on 3/19/09 to three groups of members in the MPLA database since 2006 who did not renew memberships for 2009. All were promised anonymity in the compilation of responses:

- Leadership Institute Participants
- Board Choice Memberships
- Free Memberships from State Conference Drawings

The messages asked for input in any of the following areas:

- reason(s) for not renewing
- overall assessment of MPLA's value as a regional professional association
- suggestions for programs or benefits which might add value for a member of MPLA

Of the 296 messages sent, 277 messages reached recipients.

- Leadership Institute participants 67
 - 27 responses 40%
- Board Choice memberships 23
 - 5 responses 22%
- Free Conference memberships 187

58 responses – 31%

The rest bounced because of invalid e-mail addresses or no contact information.

As of March 26, 2009, 90 responses were received, a 32% overall return.

Note: These numbers do not represent all past members in these groups. The database has identified these types of memberships only since 2006.

The Executive Secretary replied to every respondent.

14 respondents said they would renew (some renewals have been received); 12 said they would consider renewing in the future.



Type of Library Focus


- MPLA just wasn't designed for librarians like me. I work in a large system, with lots of professional resources,



Suggestions/comments

- As a school librarian I would appreciate programming on AASL's updated standards

General

- I don't necessarily understand how the librarians of Kansas relate to the librarians of Utah any more than the librarians of Delaware, so I would think that MPLA might be more appropriate as a group within ALA which it is in some ways but why does it have its own dues?
- My suggestion for programs or benefits which might add value for a member of MPLA would be more of a marketing strategy. It would include a quick history of why and how MPLA got started, feature that the benefits are comparable to ALA, and why it ends up being more valuable for members.
- If my state didn't have such a strong state association, I would certainly be a member of MPLA.
