Background: MemberClicks gives us some code we can paste into our webpages, that creates those login boxes. When we revamped the website in April, Roy and I looked at the code supplied by MemberClicks and "streamlined" it. Needless to say, MemberClicks changed something on their end, and it knocked the login box redesign offline. The login boxes still work on a secondary page, so I have changed the login boxes atop each page to a link named MEMBER LOGIN, which takes members to the boxes for logging into MemberClicks.
