## COLORADO REPORT TO MPLA BOARD MEETING, OCTOBER 25, 2000 Suzanne Taylor

## CLA Annual Conference

The annual conference, Enhancing Information: Libraries Add Value, was held at Snowmass, CO, on Sept. 14-17, 2000. Highlights of the conference included Walt Crawford, Bill Gordon, Nancy Kranich, Herb White, Connie Willis, movies, exhibitors, line dancing and the music of Rodeo Cool. The weather was lovely, although it was just slightly early to see the fall colors. The important news from the conference is below:

## Federation of Colorado Libraries

After some discussion, the CLA membership voted to accept the proposed Federation of Colorado Libraries. This new association merges the Colorado Library Association and the Colorado Educational Media Association (CEMA). CEMA had already voted to accept the merger. One rationale for the merger is to show a united front when library issues come before the state legislature. The Federation structure will be very different from that of CLA. One very significant change is that the MPLA representative will be an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Federation Board. Policies and procedures will be worked out by an Implementation Task Force that is currently being formed. The targeted date for the Federation to be in place is Fall 2002.
