Nine Colorado librarians submitted applications to the 2007 Leadership Institute. One did not qualify, two highly qualified individuals were recommended for participation, and one name was forwarded as a possible alternate. The excellent pool of applicants made this a very difficult process, and my hope is that those who were not selected this year will try again next year.
