- The long-awaited expansion of the Lied Scottsbluff Public Library is underway. The groundbreaking ceremony on February 23<sup>rd</sup> was celebrated by city leaders, library staff, library trustees, Friends of the Library, Foundation members, and other supporters. Congratulations to all who worked so long and hard to make this library dream happen!
- After 14 months of renovation, the Library/Archives Reference Room at the Nebraska State Historical Society reopened on March 9<sup>th</sup> in Lincoln. Although the research room is slightly smaller, bathrooms are now closer. - Omaha.net (<a href="http://omaha.net">http://omaha.net</a>), a new online magazine, has taken a great interest in the Omaha Public Library. - The Spring Colloquium 2010 on May 13<sup>th</sup> featured Terry Pettit, former coach of the University of Nebraska's Women's Volleyball Team. His presentation focused on collaborative leadership, creative problem solving, and leading with both sides of the brain. These topics are also the major themes in his recently released book, *Talent and the Secret Life of Teams*.
- Karla Shafer, Hooper Public Library Director, is the ALA Office for Literacy and Outreach Services [OLOS] "poster child". According to Dale Lipschultz, Literary Officer, "Karla is the best spokesperson...a natural." Ms. Lipschultz told Karla, via phone, that negotiations for a second round of Dollar General Foundation funding for the "American Dream Starts @your library" program were tenuous. After the foundation representatives were shown Karla's PowerPoint 2008 Final Report, the atmosphere changed. "When the lights came up at the end of the PowerPoint, one of the Dollar General Foundation representatives turned to Ms. Lipschultz and said, 'How much money do you want?' They subsequently

decided to give \$750,000 to 21 states in the second literacy project." The libraries being first funded in the new grant round are in Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, and, of course, Hooper, Nebraska.
