Pioneer Consortium Reaches Agreement with PTFS for Open Source ILS Solution

Five Nebraska libraries called the Pioneer Consortium successfully concluded a Library Improvement Grant received from the Nebraska Library Commission. In this project, the Pioneer Consortium determined the feasibility of utilizing open source integrated library system (ILS) software for its members' circulation, cataloging, etc. needs. This alternative would replace their existing ILS systems and could eventually be an option for libraries across the state.

The Consortium chose the Koha open source product and the second path of operation. They reached an agreement with LibLime, a division of Progressive Technology Federal System Inc. (PTFS), headquartered in Bethesda, MD. Koha will provide ILS services to Grand Island Public Library, Gretna Public Library, Holdrege Public Library, Lincoln City Libraries, and St. Paul Public Library.
