Nebraska Library Association (NLA) Spring Meetings

The 2011 spring meetings hosted by NLA's sections and roundtables have begun. This year's schedule includes –

- Collaboration Across Libraries presented by the Paraprofessional and Special & Institutional Sections on March 24th.
