"From Ideas to Implementation" a seminar sponsored by the Nevada State Library from September 9 through September 13, 2002.

The purpose of this seminar is to promote, expand, innovate, and elevate the services of each library. The seminar will be conducted with emphasis on audience participation to the degree that at the end of the conference, each participant will be able to understand and replicate the components that produce marketing results.
