New Mexico Representative MPLA Board Report

State Aid for Public Libraries House Bill 185, introduced by Rep. Danice Picraux is currently making its rounds through the legislature. Full approval of the bill would change New Mexico's state aid to public libraries from \$350,000 to \$1.6 million.

Funding for Tribal Library Programs Two bills, Senate Bill 654 and Senate Bill 658, have been introduced by Senator Leonard Tsosie. SB 654 makes an appropriation of \$95,500 for the State Library's Tribal Libraries program for cultural preservation activities and other programming. SB 658 \$100,000 from the general fund to the Cultural Affairs Department for expenditure in fiscal year 2006 and subsequent fiscal years for the State Library's expansion of permanent funding for the Tribal Libraries Program.

New Website Unveiled Telling the Stories is a new web site for the Native American communities in New Mexico to communicate information in written, spoken, and visual formats in their own languages. Developed by the New Mexico State Library's Tribal Libraries Program through a grant to the Indigenous Language Institute in Santa Fe, Telling the Stories is intended to contribute to the preservation of New Mexico's Native American language and culture by providing links to resources, tools, and educational opportunities that are available to assist Native American communities to language and cultural preservation programs.

New Mexico Library Association Conference The annual conference, "Libraries Lend a Hand," will take place in Albuquerque on March 30th - April 1st. Highlights include an exhibit held at the Albuquerque Museum, "From Goodnight Moon to Art Dog: The World of Clement, Edith and Thacher Hurd;" Keynote Speaker Marilyn Mason from WebJunction OCLC, and Lt. New Mexico Library Foundation Has a New Mission "The New Mexico Library Foundation will support identified needs of New Mexico libraries.
