News from the Oklahoma Legislature, which is gearing up for a very challenging session, is that state agency budgets will be cut up to 15%. The state is facing budget shortfalls and may use some Rainy Day Funds. There are no bills filed so far that deal with censorship issues, but there are several bills that recommend Charter Schools. In the past these proposals have asked for removal of the mandate for school librarians (and incidentally school custodians and counselors) in public schools by allowing public schools to abide by the regulations for charter schools.
