The first South Dakota Festival of the Book was held October 3-5 in Deadwood, South Dakota. Over 100 national, regional and SD authors participated in the event. Activities included author readings and talks, children's activities, author receptions, and book signings. Organizers and participants considered the event a success. Next year the Festival will be held in Sioux Falls, August 27-28.

Peggy Williams and her husband, Bruce, joined SD author, Kathryn Akipa, to represent South Dakota and the State Library at the National Book Festival. One of the activities at the pavilion of the states is to collect a stamp representing a literary tradition of each state on a map provided by the organizers. Peggy reported that the demand "to be stamped" kept them very busy all day.

South Dakota Library Association, in conjunction with the Midcontinental Chapter of the Medical Library Association, held their annual conference in Sioux Falls, October 15-18. The theme was "Creative Partnering." Kristin Anderson, co-author of Delivering Knock Your Socks Off Service was the keynote speaker on Thursday.
