2005/2006 SDLA Officers Elected.

The 2005 SDLA Convention was held October 5-7 in Pierre, SD. New officers have been elected for the 2005/2006 South Dakota Library Association. Several libraries in South Dakota are involved in building/renovation projects. Siouxland Libraries recently opened their new Oak View Branch. The branch serves a growing population on the northeast side of Sioux Falls. It is a full service branch, providing popular and timely materials in a variety of formats, Internet access, children's programs, study and quiet rooms, and meeting rooms. Sioux Falls residents now have access to the downtown main Sioux Falls Public Library, the Caille Branch, the Ronning Branch, and the new Oak View Branch libraries. Also, rural residents in Minnehaha County, surrounding Sioux Falls, may utilize branch libraries located in several small communities throughout the County.

Freeman Public Library has been raising funds for a new library building located on Main Street. The new building will offer 5,000 sq. ft. as opposed to the 800 sq. ft. in which the library currently operates. Total estimated cost is \$755,000. The Fundraising Committee and Staff are diligently working to raise the remaining \$30,000 needed to complete the funding package which includes grants, library reserves, city funds, and donations.

The City of Tea, SD recently announced that it will be establishing a public library that will share resources and space with the new Tea High School Library.

Harrisburg, SD is in the process of creating a new public library.

Piedmont, SD is in the process of creating a new public library.

Custer County Library will soon complete the remodeling of a city building in Hermosa and will be opening the new Hermosa Branch Library.

The Hill City Public Library recently learned that they will be given the previous Youth Center building to be remodeled into a new library. This will allow them to move from the basement of City Hall to a much more visible location near the school.

South Dakota Library Association joins SDOG (South Dakotan for Open Government). The SD State Newspaper Association formed the SDOG in 2003. Their purpose is to "promote access to government officials, records, meetings and actions... through education of the public and government officials of the need for citizens to know and understand their government's operations. The SDOG will provide a panel discussion during the October 2005 South Dakota Library Association Convention.

University of North Texas offers a distance education program that includes two intensive four day class sessions at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis, MN. She received her library undergraduate degree from Black Hills State University in SD, worked at Mikkelsen Library, Augustana College in Sioux Falls, SD, and is currently the Reference/Interlibrary Loan Librarian at the Huron Public Library in SD.
