The 2011 ULA Annual Conference will be held May 11-13, 2011 in Layton. The keynote speaker will be Audra Caplan, current President of the Public Library Association. Luncheon speakers include "Gene Ambaum" and Bill Barnes, the authors of the Unshelved e-comic strip and Scott Douglas, co-author of the book *Quiet Please, Dispatches from a Public Librarian*. Other presenters include Adam Selzer, the author of *How to Get Suspended and Influence People* and other books and screenplays; Diane Tixier Herald, the director of the Center for Adolescent Reading and a popular readers' advisory speaker. Popular storyteller and author Katy Rydell is presenting a pre-conference that is sponsored by a MPLA grant.
