## **Wyoming Library Association 2013 Annual Conference**

The WLA 2013 Annual Conference was held at Little America in Cheyenne, Wyoming at the October 2<sup>nd</sup> through October 5<sup>th</sup>.

The WLA Opening Reception was held on October 2nd at the historic Cheyenne Depot Museum. Thanks to ProQuest for sponsoring the event.

The keynote speaker for this year's conference was Lee Rainie. Lee is the Director of the Pew Research Center's Internet & American Life Project, a nonprofit, nonpartisan "fact tank" that studies the social impact of the internet.

One of this year's conference's featured children's authors is Rich Wallace. Mr. Wallace is the acclaimed author of a wide range of books for children and teenagers. His first novel, Wrestling Sturbridge, was an ALA Top 10 Selection for Young Adults and a YALSA 100 Best of the Best for the 20th Century. Many award-winning novels have followed including Shots on Goal, War and Watermelon, and Sports Camp. Wicked Cruel--his 2013 release--is a trilogy of thought-provoking and spooky urban legends.

Another featured children's author from this year's conference is Sandra Neil Wallace. The first woman to host an NHL hockey broadcast on network TV, Sandra is now a full-time author. She wrote the inspirational achievements of the 1950 Jerome Muckers football team in her book called Muckers.
